



The proposals support residential-led, sustainable riverside regeneration with a community focus

- Supporting Salford City Council's ambitions for high-density, residential-led growth in the Ordsall Waterfront Area of the Local Plan (2023).
- Creates a new two-storey hub at the Pavilion building for community life with scope for uses such as a café, fitness, health services to space for local events.

Creates areas of new public space and opens up the riverside

- Access to the River Irwell walkway with connections to Salford Quays and Manchester City Centre.
- New pedestrian routes from Ordsall Lane, step-free riverside access, and carefully managed public areas to ensure everyone feels safe, comfortable and connected.

Builds on local character and heritage

- Paying homage to the former Globe Bottling Works which was once on the site.
- The proposed brick facades and ventilation screens take inspiration from the site history, creating a distinct sense of place while looking to the future.

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Delivering Benefits FOR SALFORD



Riverside Place is a major regeneration opportunity with an impact beyond the site itself.

Investing in Salford's future, the benefits that the scheme could deliver include:

- Over 1,000 full time jobs during construction.
- Around £67m GVA injected into the local economy over the three-year build period.
- A£3.3m long-term boost in gross value added from future residents.
- New household spend of £23m supporting 86 new jobs locally and GVA of £3.3m per year nurturing shops, services, and Salford at large.
- Potential for more than 80 permanent jobs supported by the Pavilion, site management, and local services.
- An estimated £1.7m per year in new council tax revenue.
- Helps deliver Salford's target of 9,000 new homes across Ordsall, the Quays, Pendleton, and Charlestown by 2042.
